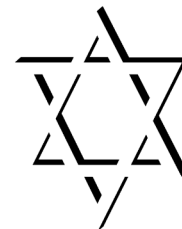

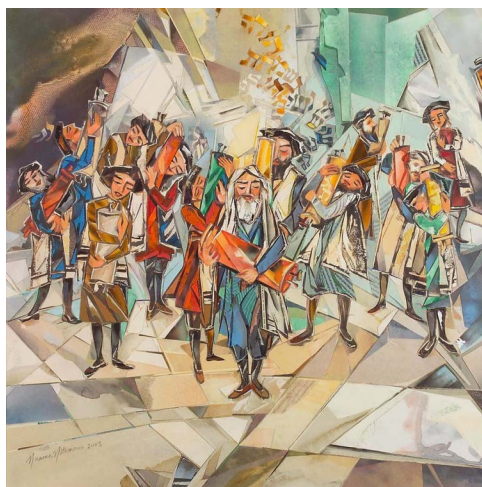

FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

Rabbi Carla Freedman

The Bible has been a bestselling book for a very long time now. It is amazing to note that until the printing press came along, the Bible, like all books, had to be copied by hand, and was therefore not available to anyone without lots of money. But the printing press made it available to masses of people for a reasonable price.

What exactly *is* the Bible, and how did it come to be so famous and popular?

The first thing to note is that the Bible is really a compendium of many books. In Jewish tradition, the first five books, Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy, constitute the Torah (Hebrew, meaning “instruction” or “teaching”). The next section of the Jewish Bible is called Prophets; it begins with a series of historical books (Joshua, Judges, Samuel I and II, and Kings I and II), and then contains the writings of the famous prophets of Israel. The third section of the Jewish Bible is called Writings, which includes the Book of Psalms, Proverbs, Esther, etc.

Jewish tradition holds that the Torah is the divinely revealed word of God, given (but...how??) to Moses at Sinai verbatim as we have it today. It is considered the holiest part of the Bible, and is the only part of the Bible always read ceremonially from a hand-lettered scroll during worship services. The section called Prophets is considered to be the message of God delivered to us in the words of God’s chosen prophets. The Writings are understood to be both the message and the words of human authors.

Over the centuries, various Jewish and Christian scholars have questioned the divinity of the Torah in particular, and less than 150 years ago, a German named Julius Wellhausen proposed a comprehensive alternate explanation of the origins of the Torah, building on the work of all the scholars before him (many of whom were severely punished as radical non-believers in their own day), and marshalling significant literary evidence to support his case. The time was right, because Charles Darwin published his theory of evolution about then; together these two ideas made it possible for people to read the Bible analytically, and to conclude that it was neither divinely revealed nor necessarily authoritative. The 19th century saw the rise of religious scepticism and dedication to scientific explanations of how the world works.

Yet, the Bible has a critical and formative place in Western civilization, and is published in virtually every language in the world; its contribution to the culture of the West is profound.

Can we revere the Bible for reasons other than its supposed connection to Divinity? How does rejection of its supposed divinity impact its authority? Are there things to be learned from the Bible, regardless of its source? Who wrote the Bible, if God did not do so? And what evidence can be offered to support this idea?

These questions will be part of our next class, to be held on **Thursdays at 3:00 pm, beginning on October 19**. We will use Professor Richard Elliot Friedman’s book, *Who Wrote the Bible?*

This will be an enjoyable and stimulating class; do join us!

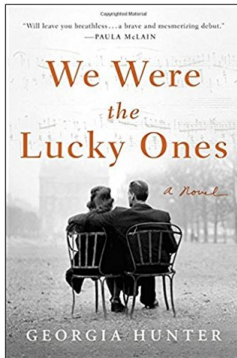

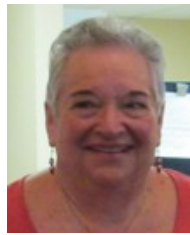

ASK THE RABBI

QUESTION : In a recent newsletter, you wrote about decorum...or, behavior, in the sanctuary. I have 2 related questions. First, can you explain how the Torah is supposed to be “dressed” so that it sits properly in the ark? And also, should I stay seated when we are going to read the Sh'ma, or another prayer for which we stand, if I haven't found the right page yet?



ANSWER 1. The scroll is attached to the two rollers so that the text can be read from right to left, as Hebrew is written. This means that **the Genesis end will always be held in the lifter's right hand.** The scroll is lifted so congregants can see where the reading was...and the Genesis end will still be in the lifter's right hand, which corresponds to congregants' right hands, because both the lifter and congregants are facing east.

When the lifter sits down facing the congregation, the scroll should be closed by *rolling the Genesis side* to meet the other side, and setting *the base of its roller atop the base of the Deuteronomy side*. Rolling the Genesis side toward the middle means that this week's reading will be covered in order to expose the reading for next week.

If the Genesis side roller is not atop the Deuteronomy side roller, the scroll will not stand properly in the ark.

So the key for the lifter and the dresser is to think through which side is the “Genesis side” of the scroll, and roll that side, placing its roller base above the other one.

The pointer (“yad” in Hebrew, meaning “hand”...because the tip of the pointer is shaped like a hand) should be draped over the Genesis side of the scroll.

2. When the congregation is asked to rise for a prayer, the correct thing to do is to rise right away, even if you haven't gotten to the right page yet, so you don't hold up the service. So you need to pay attention to the page number announced, rise quickly, *and then* find the page in the prayerbook.

Though I do sometimes skip around in the prayerbook, in general, the book is arranged so that, within a specific service, the prayers flow from one page to the next. I only skip around for alternate English readings and try to leave a few moments for turning back to the earlier section of the book that we are using at that service. So that should not create a problem, because the prayers that we stand for are always in Hebrew.

The general principle is that the service should not be delayed because someone is still seated, trying to find the right page. Besides, you probably know *by heart* at least the beginning of the Barkhu, the Sh'ma, the Amidah, the Torah service, the Aleynu, and Mourners' Kaddish.

Think of this as respect for the community, which should come before personal convenience.

Both of these questions touch on how to contribute to the smooth running of the service, and warrant everyone's attention.

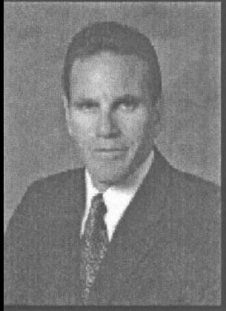

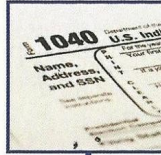
