FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

Some think of it as the holiday season. Others think of it as the gift-giving/receiving season. For some there are spiritual resonances. For others, it is all about family.

But they are all wrong. This "holiday season" is now nothing but commercial. It is all about merchants making about 60% of their annual profit in the final eight weeks of the calendar year. The number of catalogs arriving daily at our house is astonishing. The

"pre-holiday" sales flyers weigh down the Sunday newspapers. The advertising on television goes into overdrive to persuade us to buy more, bigger, expensive gifts for those we love, the implication being that a lesser gift would convey less love. Kids start asking for (lobbying for?) specific items advertised on television, expecting that all their friends will get them, and if our kids don't, they will be rejected by their peers. And of course, there is "Black Friday"...the day after Thanksgiving, with some stores opening at midnight on Thursday, to get their bottom line into the black (and now there are stores open all day on Thanksgiving...nothing is sacred except money).

I have for years said that Chanukah is a minor holiday on the Jewish calendar, because it is about events that took place after the Torah was completed (regardless of your understanding of how we got the Torah, by 167 BCE and the adventures of the Maccabees, the Torah as we know it was complete), and therefore is not mentioned in the Torah. Thus it contains no days on which work is prohibited, except for the Shabbat which inevitably falls during Chanukah (sometimes there are two such Shabbatot, when Chanukah begins and ends on Shabbat). Purim, which is also about events that happened after the Torah was completed, is another occasion when work is not prohibited...unless it coincides with Shabbat.

The famous adoption of Santa Claus by Coca Cola in 1923 probably contributed hugely to the commercialization of the season, though it did not begin the process. And for a long time, marketers seemed not to notice that their Jewish audience was largely immune to the advertising and the spending that it begot. Then little touches entered the advertising, aimed at us...a lit menorah in the background, or a spinning dreidl amidst the presents. While shopping in grocery stores, where the "holiday muzak" played endlessly from Thanksgiving onward, we gradually became aware of a musical version of *Oy Chanukah* added to the mix, or even *I Have a Little Dreidl*.

School holiday concerts, inescapable as they are, also began to incorporate some Chanukah music and/or imagery. This was supposed to make our kids feel comfortable and included. Parents began to visit their kids' schools to serve up latkes and teach everyone how to play dreidl. The eight days of Chanukah became eight days for presents. WE WERE HAD!

So I issue my annual challenge: celebrate Chanukah on its own terms. We play down the military aspect of the occasion, and celebrate a season of light at the darkest time of the year. Consider this way to spread the light of Chanukah: set aside one can or package of non-perishable food for each day of candle lighting, to bring some light and joy to a family less fortunate this holiday season. Make this your holiday mitzvah, and get the food to a food pantry as soon as Chanukah ends. You will make your holiday and theirs more meaningful and satisfying. HAPPY CHANUKAH.

CREAMY PEACH NOODLE KUGEL

Ingredients:

- 1 pound wide noodles
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 29oz. can sliced peaches drained and diced
- 1 cup melted butter
- 4 large eggs
- 1 pint sour cream (I use light)
- 1 pint small curd cottage cheese
- 1 tablespoon almond extract
- cinnamon

Boil noodles and drain.

Put sugar, peaches, butter, eggs (beaten), sour cream, cottage cheese and almond extract in a large bowl and mix well.

Add noodles and mix well.

Spray a 9x13 baking dish with Pam and pour mixture into baking dish.

Level mixture and cover with cinnamon.


Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour to 1 hour and 10 minutes. The top should be crispy and nicely browned.

ASK THE RABBI

QUESTION : I have attended a number of your classes, and notice that you can speak for hours without notes of any kind, yet when you present a sermon, you always read it. Why? The note-free style is so much more engaging



ANSWER: I of course agree that a presentation without notes is more engaging. But the reason I read sermons lies in the inherent difference between a class presentation and a sermon.

A sermon is a *formal* learned presentation, whether in written or spoken form, intended to be morally or otherwise instructive, usually based on specific texts (Biblical, Talmudic, etc) marshalled to make a carefully developed point. For example, if I wanted to argue that the Bible does *not* say "though shalt not kill", I would have to cite Biblical verses that specifically mandate killing. I would have to explain that Hebrew has different words for "murder" and "killing", and then cite specific instances of both. And then I would have to draw conclusions from the way the different words are used.

I could give an oral presentation on the same subject, but the organization of the discourse does not have to be as structured or as carefully laid out (which is not to say that it wouldn't be structured or laid out carefully....just not as much as a sermon should be).

In a class situation, there is usually not as much need to cite sources as there is in a formal presentation (like a sermon). If there is, I usually ask participants to bring their own Bible or whatever source we will consult, but there is no time for that in a sermon.

Since a sermon is a crafted presentation, making points along the way to a moral or educational message, it needs to be carefully developed. Speaking extemporaneously, one runs the risk of leaving out key points. Some of the subtle but useful writing techniques, like word play, logic, and structure are vital to sermons but not necessarily to oral presentations.

On the other hand, in oral presentations, one can use repetition and verbal cues which would seem excessive and annoying in a more formal presentation.

As I hope you can see, a sermon is a more complex and sophisticated undertaking than an oral presentation. I often feel that this is not appreciated by listeners; it takes more work for a listener to discern some of the finer points of a sermon, including structure and development of thought, than to get the point of a lecture or presentation.

So I will be reading sermons, out of a commitment to what they require, and I hope you will listen for their hallmarks.

And keep coming to classes anyway!!


